Bring your garden tool and your beverage.

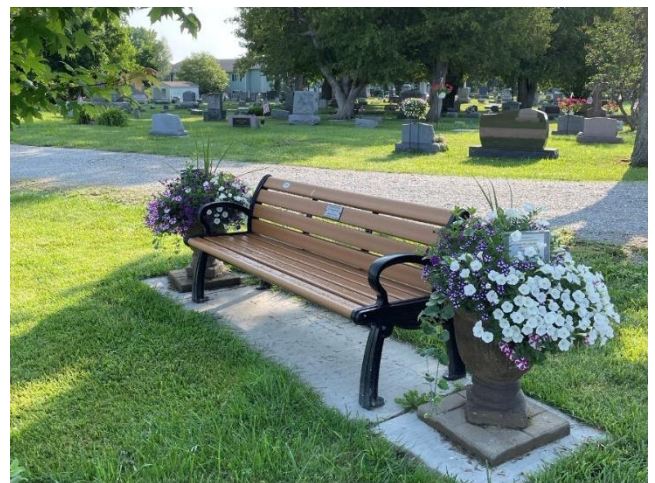

Summer Projects

Many people power washing their siding, decks, patios, and porches to prepare for summer gatherings and to keep their homes looking nice.

If you plan on doing any power washing, please be mindful of the types of detergents and chemicals that will be used. When you use a power washer, the runoff may flow off your property to the nearest storm drain or water body, carrying all the dirt and chemicals with it. Be careful and protect our clean water.

Summer inspires many of us to tackle home repairs/modifications/additions. Some projects require a land use permit from the Village of Lexington, Sanilac County land use/construction permits, others do not. Check the zoning ordinance, county codes, call the Village office or Sanilac County Land Use and Construction Department (810) 648-4664 if you are unsure.

Make sure you have what you need before starting the project.

USDA Water and Sewer Projects

Happy spring to everyone from the Lexington Utilities Department. For those of you that stayed through the winter you probably know about all the work that has been completed with the USDA water and sewer projects throughout the winter months, but for those of you that are just returning or that will be shortly, here are some of the things that you will be returning to. Sanitary sewer lines have been installed along M-25 north of town towards Harrington Rd. with a new lift station installed on the N/W corner of the North Shores Mobile Home Park grounds. This line will service our existing customers on Birch Drive as well as new customers along the way. New water main has been installed on Lester St. west of the water plant to Union St. Union St. from Lester to Simons St. Lake St. from Union to the front of the school. Boynton St. from Union St. to Main St. Henry and Simons St. from Huron Ave. to Union St., and Simons St. from Union St. to Main St. This project included replacement of aged cast iron mains with new plastic mains. This will improve fire flows, help with pressure drops and the physical aesthetics of the water that we provide to you. We appreciate the patience that has been shown as far as traffic interruptions, along with both planned and unplanned service interruptions that have been experienced along the way. Restoration of the project areas has not been completed yet so there is still work to be done. Crews will be restoring disturbed areas back to the way that they were found, so please be patient until these final items are finished.

Village utility staff will also again be conducting state required water distribution system materials inventory inspections of service lines to homes. This means that a number of residents picked from a random list of customers will need to have an inspection of their service line material performed by village staff. There will be no fees regarding this inspection.
